Straub Family Visit & Donations

The Straub family has frequently made pilgrimages back to Milton for special occasions, as evidenced by newspaper articles. But in their recent visit, they endowed us with a treasure trove of Straub and related families photos, newspaper clippings, deeds and sale bills, and 2 family Bibles. While the newspaper report that one of these Bibles traveled from Germany with immigrant Andrew Straub, founder of Milton was incorrect, still we are thankful to have these Bibles return home to Milton so that this local history can be preserved.

The first Bible, in German, was copyrighted 1842 and was the Bible of the John Schleppy family with connections to the Balliet and Straub families. The second Bible (in photo) was copyrighted 1870 and is the Balliet ~ Straub Family. Both Bibles have been transcribed and that genealogical data will be preserved and shared.

More Straub Family Treasures

How exciting it was to look through the small leather bound business account books of Jacob Straub of Chillisquaque and find these two important notations!

Jacob Straub built a chimney for James Cameron in 1857 for a total of \$3.50! It would be very cool if we knew this chimney was on the newer portion of our beautiful house but James Cameron owned quite a few properties so there's no way to tell.

And to the right, Jacob Straub sold a bushel of tomatoes in September 1855 to none other than Milton resident and future Governor James Pollock for a whopping 50 cents!

Governor James Pollock Medal


Local resident and longtime friend of the historical society Nancy Slease recently donated this fabulous Governor Pollock Medal.


